Service Animals on Campus

Service animals performing tasks for individuals with disabilities are very welcome on the UW campus and in all University buildings, busses, and other spaces. The ADA recognizes dogs and miniature horses as service animals. No other animals or pets, however, are allowed in university buildings other than those approved to reside with their owners in University housing accommodations.

To determine if a dog or miniature horse is a service animal you may ask ONLY the following questions:

- Is your animal a service animal/required because of a disability?
- What task is your animal trained to do?
 (You may NOT ask what disability the animal assists with.)
